

⁵If any of you is lacking in wisdom, ask God, who gives to all generously and ungrudgingly, and it will be given [to] you. ⁶ But ask in faith, never doubting, for the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, driven and tossed by the wind[.] [...]

¹⁹You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; ²⁰ for your anger does not produce God's righteousness ²¹ [...] welcome with meekness the implanted word that has the power to save your souls.



- ⁵ You also must be patient. Strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near.
