THE FIRST READING

Numbers 21:4-9

The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." Then the LORD sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many Israelites died. For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life.
