On Sunday, November 3, at both the 8:00 and 10:30 AM worship services, St. Paul's will present Michael John Trotta's Light Shines in the Darkness.

The Chancel Choir voices will be supported by a string ensemble and piano.

Composer Michael John Trotta, 46, was born in Point Pleasant N.J. and is a graduate of Rowan University and Louisiana State University.

Light Shines in the Darkness is a multi-movement work that draws on texts from scripture as well a diverse collection of writers including Virgil, John Donne, Rabindranath Tagore, Mary Elizabeth Frye, Vachel Lindsay, and Fiona Macleod that examine the many facets of death, the pain of transitions, and the hope and joy of a better place. This is a beautiful, powerful message as we remember our loved ones who have gone before us on All Saints Sunday.
