Here's what to do: take your (unbagged) lights to Mom's Organic Market (925 Easton Rd., Abington PA 19001, 267-341-1550) and put them in the marked bin near the front entrance. You can also contact Janet Bischoff, and she will deliver your lights to Mom's. Call her at 215-543-0494 to make arrangements. Mom's is accepting old holiday lights from now until **January 31**. Nationally, Mom's customers diverted 17 tons of holiday lights from the landfill last year! This is a good way of caring for creation, and we're grateful for the opportunity to join in.

CHICKS - When chicks grow up to become chickens, their eggs not only provide an ongoing supply of protein-rich meals but can also help start a small business and generate a steady source of income.

ROOSTER - Adding a rooster to a chicken coop helps a farm grow! More chickens on the farm mean more eggs to eat and to sell at the market. **HONEYBEES** - Honeybees provide honey to eat and beeswax to transform into handcrafted soaps and candles, allowing a farmer to start a small business selling these products.
