Artist Kate Strachan, the daughter of St. Paul's members





SEPTA Bridge Work on Easton Road Repair and replacement of SEPTA's rail bridge over Easton Road will begin on March 17. Easton Road will be closed between Mt. Carmel Avenue and Glenside Avenue beginning on March 17

and running through April. Traffic on Easton Road will be detoured down Mt. Carmel Avenue, which will impact St. Paul's. Expect delays getting into the church parking lot from Roberts Avenue.

Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another. *The assembly kneels or stands. Silence is kept for reflection.*




1 Corinthians 15:12-20
