



Offering of Letters June 15, 2025

Urge Congress to Restore and Protect Lifesaving Aid Programs

Eighty-three percent of all U.S. aid contracts have been officially cancelled. Without lifesaving aid, tens of millions of people will be at risk of losing access to clean water, sanitation, nutrition assistance, and medicine. Children are especially vulnerable unless these programs are restored and protected.

Urge Congress to Reject SNAP and Medicaid Cuts

Congress is considering legislation that could result in hundreds of billions of dollars in funding cuts from both the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Medicaid. These cuts would greatly impact the ability of low-income families to put food on the table during a time when grocery prices are rising.

These funding cuts impact tens of millions of the most vulnerable populations around the world. Programs that provide vital assistance must be able to continue to do so without devastating disruption. Bread for the World's 2025 Offering of Letters calls for the restoration of lifesaving USAID programs and funding and for the protection of domestic nutrition programs. You will have the opportunity on Sunday, June 15, to participate in this letter-writing campaign, urging Congress to reinstate and protect this critical aid.

Nearly one in ten people around the world goes to bed hungry. One in four children under age five is severely malnourished. But it doesn't have to be this way. Every voice matters. Together we can urge elected leaders to restore and protect the policies and programs that make a difference for people struggling with hunger in the U.S. and around the world, ensuring every person has the opportunity to flourish.
